

FACTSHEET NO. 3: MOTORING AND PARKING

Blue Badge Scheme

If you have problems with walking or other serious mobility problems you may be able to get a Blue Badge to enable you to park your car near shops and other places you wish to visit. You will be automatically entitled if you are on high rate mobility component of DLA, enhanced rate of PIP, or are registered as severely sight impaired. Reporting Missing/Lost Blue Badges

If you lose your Blue Badge you will need to visit www.gov.uk/report-lost-stolen-blue-badge and complete the form. If your badge is stolen you will need to report it to the police first to get a crime reference number, which you will need in order to complete the form online.

Free Road Tax Disc

You can get a free tax disc if you get the enhanced mobility component of Personal Independence Payment (PIP), the high rate mobility component of Disability Living Allowance, or are getting War Pensioners Mobility Supplement/Armed Forces Independence Payment.

You can also get a 50% discount on your road tax if you receive the standard mobility component of PIP. For more information see <https://www.gov.uk/financial-help-disabled/vehicles-and-transport> or www.disabledmotoring.org/motoring/road-tax-exemption

Congestion Charge Exemption

If you hold a valid Blue Badge in the European Economic Area, you are eligible to register for a 100 percent discount, even if you don't own a vehicle or drive.

You can register up to two vehicles that you would normally use to travel within the charging zone. This could be your own vehicle, or one you travel in. Please note you can also register a one-off or occasional driver but you will need to call 0434 222 2222 on the day of the journey.

Fill in the registration form on this website: <https://www.tfl.gov.uk/modes/driving/congestion-charge/discounts-and-exemptions>. Once you have received an approval letter, you can drive or be driven in the zone, free. Until then, you must pay the charge.

You have to pay £10 for this discount.

Motability cars are automatically exempt from the charge.

Disabled Parking Bays

If you are a resident of Hillingdon you may be eligible for a personal car parking bay. Below is a list of the criteria:

- applicant must be a resident of Hillingdon borough and a registered 'Blue Badge' holder, with severe mobility difficulties
- applicant must be in receipt of the higher rate mobility component of DLA, enhanced mobility component of PIP (or attendance allowance if over the age of 65)
- a car must be registered at the address stated in the application form
- where off-street parking facilities are available a bay may only be provided if the applicant can demonstrate that the facilities are unsuitable for the use of a disabled person due to the nature of their disability
- disabled person's parking places will only be approved at locations where road safety will not be adversely affected by their provision.

Carer's Permit

If you a resident in Hillingdon borough, and you have regular, ongoing care needs which mean that you need a carer to visit, you may be eligible for a carer's permit.

The permit is issued to you, and must be kept at your address. It is only to be used in your controlled parking zone.

The Motability Scheme

The Motability Scheme can help you with leasing or buying a car, powered wheelchair or scooter. You'll need to be getting the higher rate of the mobility component of Disability Living Allowance, enhanced mobility component of Personal Independence Payment or War Pensioners' Mobility Supplement.
